#### Dear CPI Friends,

Child Parent Institute is proud of a long history of successes that have brought us to a place of providing quality family support services to tens of thousands of parents and children. In the 44 years of providing services, our mission of ending child abuse and strengthening the healthof children, parents, and families has remained our focus. As you will see in our impact report, we provide a broad range of services, and touch the lives of many families in Sonoma County.

CPI has adopted the following principles that direct the work we do: understanding how ACES impact lifelong health outcomes; using a trauma-informed, two-generational, approach serving both the parents and children as the best avenue for the healthiest outcomes; embracing/ respecting all families with regards to their culture, belief systems, and values; using a strength-based approach that helps children, educates and supports parents, and enhances resilience in both children and parents.

During the wildfires and the pandemic we have experienced collective trauma, which requires a focus on the strength of collective resilience. We have found that the sum of our systems of care, when mobilized together, can hold the most vulnerable among us in a supportive and nurturing community environment.

With the help of dedicated and generous board members, employees, donors and volunteers, our programs address the needs of children and parents to create stronger and healthier communities.

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# **5 PROTECTIVE FACTORS**

Every program and service offered at CPI addresses one or more of the 5 Protective Factors for Strengthening Families. Using this framework, we ensure that operating dollars are applied effectively to give families the best possible outcomes.



### SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL COMPETENCE

Children's early experiences of being nurtured and developing a positive relationship with a caring adult affect all aspects of behavior and development.



### **KNOWLEDGE OF PARENTING & CHILD DEVELOPMENT**

Children thrive when parents provide not only affection, but also respectful communication and listening, consistent rules and expectations, and safe opportunities that promote independence.



### RESILIENCE

Parents who can cope with the stresses of everyday life, as well as a crisis, have resilience; they have the flexibility and inner strength necessary to bounce back when things are not going well.



### **CONCRETE SUPPORT**

Families who can meet their own basic needs for food, clothing, housing, and transportation - and who know how to access essential services such as childcare, health care, and mental health services to address family-specific needs - are better able to ensure the safety and well-being of their children.



### SOCIAL CONNECTIONS

Parents with a social network of emotionally supportive friends, family, and neighbors often find that it is easier to care for their children and themselves.



# Client Story

Carrie met with a therapist in the Postpartum **Depression Program** to help with stress and anxiety following a traumatic pregnancy and birth of her child. Together they worked on increasing regulation skills, building back up self-care habits, and managing her own anxiety and frustration. At closing - Carrie told her therapist she had been more regulated emotionally and that she has been able to have more positive social connections with her friends and support system.

## COUNSELING

At the heart of our mission at CPI is our commitment to protecting the children and families in our community. Our Child & Family Counseling Clinic provides comprehensive mental health services to children ages 0-18 and their families.


